Location	The salt mine is located in Berchtesgaden, signposts lead to the salt mine.
Arrival by car	<p>You can reach the newly designed adventure mine in Berchtesgaden from Germany on the A8 or from Tyrol using the A93 to the Inntaldreieck [Inn Valley Triangle] and then continuing on the A8 heading towards Salzburg. Then either leave the motorway at the Bad Reichenhall/Berchtesgaden exit or continue on the Tauern motorway in the direction of Villach (A10) until you reach the Salzburg Süd/Grödig exit. From here, take Salzburgerstraße in the direction of Berchtesgaden. From east Austria, travel on the western motorway (A1) to Salzburg, then on the Tauern motorway (A10) to the Salzburg Süd/Grödig exit. From south Austria, use the Tauern</p> <p>motorway (A10) and leave the motorway at the Salzburg Süd/Grödig exit, travelling along Salzburgerstraße in the direction of Berchtesgaden. From here, turn directly right and you will see the car park.</p>
Arrival by train	Berchtesgaden has an IC-rail connection, which provides good direct connections to all the important centres of Germany and Austria.

By plane	The nearest airport is Salzburg, approx. 20 km from Berchtesgaden. Hapag Lloyd Express currently flies (as at April 2007) from Köln-Bonn, Düsseldorf, Hannover, Hamburg, Berlin to Salzburg. Munich airport, about 150 km away, is served by all major national and international airlines.

Catchment area	Regional radius of up to 250 kilometres around Berchtesgaden with the cities of Salzburg and Innsbruck, southern Bavaria with Munich, north Bavaria through to Passau, Allgäu
Concept/focus	The huge tradition of salt mining has determined part of the region's essence for hundreds of years. The SalzZeitReise makes it possible to experience this history with the latest means of entertainment, edutainment and infotainment. The eventful visitor tour, active and interactive control modules, light installation, sensory experiences and learning stations guide the visitor through a completely new underground experience. Stefan Seigner from Intertainment Kulturmanagement GmbH is responsible for the concept and its implementation.

Surface area	<p>6,750 m² surface area Of which 6,000 m² underground adventure, the new salt shop with 150 m², the new visitor centre with 600 m² About 30 kilometres of tunnels in the whole mine; diameter of connecting tunnel approx. 2 metres; Length of entrance/exit with the mining railroad approx. 5 minutes per stretch. The entire tour lasts about two hours including clothing and entrance.</p>
Salt mines which can be toured	<p>The Kaiser-Franz-Sinkwerk (salt cathedral) and the Von-Senna-Sinkwerk (Spiegelsee lake)</p>
Brine mining	<p>The Salt Mine Berchtesgaden is one of the few remaining active German salt mines; daily brine production of about 1,650 cubic metres.</p>
Employees in brine production	<p>A total of 100 employees, of which 50 work underground.</p>
